Additional thoughts and notes:

Questions for group discussion:

1. Why do you think so many couples focus all their time on getting ready for the wedding, rather than getting ready for the marriage?
2. How do you think most couples would answer the question, “why are you getting married?” or “why are you still married?”
3. How have you already seen pain from your past to affect your relationship?
4. What was the most meaningful thing that you heard today?

Preparation for Next Session:

1. Pray and ask God if there is someone from your past you need to forgive. Complete the first phase of the forgiveness process, and begin phase 2.
2. Keep the new poison out! Work on biblical apologies.
3. Talk about the following questions together as a couple:
 - What are three things from your home growing up that you want to repeat in your marriage and family?
 - What are three things from your home growing up that you *don't* want to repeat in your marriage and family?
 - How have you dealt with hurt and apologies in your relationship up until this point? What needs to change?
 - Do you see “over-reactions” in each other? How could you help each other grow through and respond better to those situations in the future?

Biblical roles in marriage hinge on the husband’s sense of purpose before God: What is your compelling vision for your life?

A powerful question for women to their husbands, “How can I help you be successful today?”

V. Are you personally right with God?

Questions for Group Discussion:

1. Sometimes people get uncomfortable talking about different roles for men and women in marriage. Why do you think this is?
2. If you had a father in your home growing up, what role did he play? Did you see the roles of provider, protector, prophet, and priest?
3. If you had a mother in your home growing up, what role did she play? Did you see the roles of helping and submitting?
4. What did you hear in this session that impacted you the most?
5. Have you made the decision in your life to trust Christ and build your marriage to the best of your ability on the Bible? If yes, what does that look like on a day to day basis? If not, what role does faith play in your life and relationship?

Preparation for Next Session:

1. Read the entire chapter of Ephesians 5 at least three times together this week.
2. Continue to talk together about the question “Why are we getting married” or “Why are we still married?” Look at the answers you wrote in our first session. Would you change anything or add anything to your original answer? Take the time to write down your new answer.
3. Talk about the following questions together:
 - Which of the four “husband roles” did your father (if he was present in your life) excel in? Which of the four roles did he most struggle with?
 - In what ways did your mother (if she was present in your life) help and submit to her husband? In what ways did she struggle?
 - What roles does the Bible currently play in your relationship?
 - Men, how would you currently express your “vision” for your life?
 - What is one thing from this past session that you want to remember and put into practice?

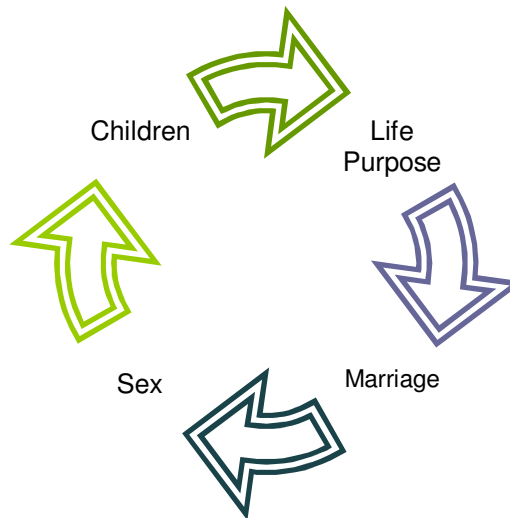

Questions for Group Discussion:

1. Why do you think the worst parts of our character come out in our most important relationships?
2. What barriers do you find in your relationship to spending time in prayer and Bible reading together?
3. Which paradigm did you see growing up? Wrapping career around the primary mission of family, or wrapping family around primary mission of career? What impact did that have on you?
4. How do you think most couples make decisions about having children?
5. How do you see the four areas being separated in our culture today? (Life purpose, marriage, sex, children)
6. What was your reaction to the 200 year vision?
7. How could your group help each other continue to grow after the sessions together are over?

Next Steps for Couples:

1. Continue to talk about your mission and purpose for your marriage. As needed, discuss and re-write your answer to “why are we getting married?” or “Why are we still married?” Save what you write down. Consider using it as a mission statement for your life together.
2. Find a mentor couple. Ask your church leaders about how you can get connected with an older, mature Christian couple who can help guide you in the months and years ahead.
3. Make an all-out commitment to practicing the disciplines of prayer and Bible reading together. A marriage foundation apart from Christ and His Word cannot sustain you going forward.
4. Talk about the following questions together as a couple:
 - What parts of today’s lesson were the most thought provoking for you?
 - Why do you think God allows the worst (and the best) of your character to come out in your relationship?
 - What is one immediately action step you can take to increase your spiritual connection time with one another?
 - Up until now, what has been your view of having children? How have you gone about the making decision of “how many how soon?”
 - What was your reaction to the 200 year vision?
